CURRENT EVENTS

The Bowling Green "life cycle" continues as our older students have completed their studies and moved on to new adventures. The graduating class included Justin Church, Kim Gedde, Mark Egge, Michael Holmes, Paul Shevock and Chih-Huan Wu.

While we can never replace these terrific people, our new class is wonderfully talented and they have already begun their own "quest for that perfect reed." The 2004 class includes six new freshmen, two graduate students and two music certificate students, from the states of Missouri, Maryland, Michigan, Ohio, Indiana, and the countries of Canada and Taiwan. Three of our new saxophonists arrived directly from musical studies in Paris, where they won high honors at various music conservatories.

In the fall, we organized six SATB quartets that played a dozen concerts during the semester. Shannon Ford (1995 MM) joined our staff in coaching chamber ensembles. We also assembled our BGSU Saxophone Choir with 26 saxophonists who performed a Young People's Concert titled "Saxophobia," featuring the great music of Rudy

Weidoeft and John Philip Sousa. Guest artists to campus included alumni James Umble (1984 MM), jazz saxophonist Jane Ira Bloom and Daniel Kientzy from Paris, who brought all seven instruments of the saxophone family, including the contrabass saxophone.

And our studio social functions included a Christmas dinner at the Beirut Restaurant in Toledo with 26 saxophonists seated at one table. We also enjoyed a lovely Christmas dessert at the home of Shannon Ford. The early morning basketball continues but the saxophone attendance is sparse (we need back our regulars like Kenny, Ku, Wu, Scotty, Paul and Kevin). The main focus for the spring semester will be a studio Ping Pong Tournament (everybody plays) with a coveted "playing and dancing battery-powered saxophonist" as first prize.


SAXOPHONE STUDENTS ABROAD
